Economic Development

Population Estimates

On July 1 of each year, The Governor's Economic and Demographic Report releases population estimates for the state's previous year.

These population estimates are formulated by using the latest decennial census data as a benchmark and incorporating administrative data from federal agencies.

The estimates help identify population shifts and trends for the state, the region and the nation, as well as indicating changes to the population of specific groups of individuals.

The 2022 estimates show a continued increase in Miami County's numbers. Only nine of the 105 counties in Kansas grew at a faster rate than Miami County. Spring Hill was the third fastest growing city by percentage year-over-year and by number of persons added. As a state, the population was estimated at 2,937,150 representing an overall increase in the past year of almost 2,600 people or 0.1% overall growth.
